# A Sociological Reading of the Impact of Nationalist Discourse on Public Policy

#### **Abstract**

Nationalist discourse, in modern states, is more than just an ideological orientation; it functions as a powerful social dynamic that directly influences decision-making processes. The construction of national identity, the reinforcement of social belonging, and the mobilization of masses during times of crisis enhance the decisive role of this discourse in shaping public policies. Nationalism, which provides an effective framework in areas such as education, security, migration, economy, language, and cultural policies, can foster social cohesion when implemented in an inclusive manner; however, when constructed in an exclusionary way, it may deepen divisions, polarization, and social tensions. This dual nature becomes particularly evident in the interaction between policymakers and civil society, where nationalist discourse sometimes serves as a unifying reference point and at other times becomes the focal point of ideological conflicts. This study examines the reflections of nationalist discourse on public policies from a sociological perspective, revealing both its unifying and exclusionary dimensions. The research combines the theoretical approaches of Gellner, Anderson, Smith, and Billig with Gramsci's concept of hegemony and Foucault's discourse analysis, focusing on the Turkish context through case studies of education curricula, migration policies, security strategies, and economic nationalism. These analyses demonstrate that nationalist discourse plays a critical role in generating social consent and legitimizing policies. At the same time, however, it carries the risk of restricting pluralism and rendering different identities invisible. Therefore, redefining nationalist discourse in a balanced, inclusive, and egalitarian manner within democratization processes is of critical importance for ensuring social peace and political stability.
